Dear Faithfuls,

As I write this, there are chrysalides in the sanctuary. Two weeks ago, they were small caterpillars, that grew huge. Now, they appear to be dead. However, we know that they are not. In a few days, butterflies will emerge. For me, butterflies are a helpful metaphor of the transforming power of our resurrecting God.

Also, as I write, John and Terri O'Brien are on their way to the southern hemisphere. They will be visiting both Australia and New Zealand, and they will be there for Easter. As spring is starting here in Nebraska, autumn is emerging 'down under.' We are so accustomed to celebrating the new life of the resurrection in the spring, when all around us new life is blossoming, I wonder how the Aussies celebrate Easter with the death of winter approaching.

This is the season of Easter, the celebration of Christ's resurrection from the dead. I believe in the 'big' resurrection after death; I also believe that there are 'little' resurrections in life, and the butterflies keep me mindful of this. Celebrating Easter even as fall approaches might be the more powerful reminder of the little resurrections of life – that when things have been a struggle, and newness unfolds, that's resurrection.

When that brother of yours, who has just been consistently mean to you, takes a turn and shows compassion, that's a little resurrection. When the child who has struggled and struggled in school, finally gets the teacher that makes a difference, that's a little resurrection. When you've been experiencing too much pain, and also doing your physical therapy exercises, and finally, the pain is gone, that's a little resurrection.

I invite you, during these 50 days of Easter, to pay attention. Pay attention to the little resurrections in your life. Pay attention to new life unfolding in some way. Pay attention to the flowers blooming and the grass growing, and the caterpillars becoming butterflies. And, then, give thanks to our resurrecting God.

What's the Legacy Fund, You Ask?

The Legacy Fund is similar to an endowment, without all the restrictions of an endowment fund. The Session approved this fund for the purpose of providing long-term financial stability for the church, while also providing funds to further the work of Jesus Christ. The Legacy Fund is accounted for separately from the regular operations of our church. The Fund was established by using \$20,000 of memorial funds, and by a \$10,000 anonymous gift, specified for the Legacy Fund.

Only the income from the Fund (interest and dividends) will be used for the above cited projects. This fund is being managed by our Finance Team, who will make recommendations to Session for any disbursements of income.

As noted above, we have already received a gift to the Legacy Fund. If you would also like to make a gift, or include the Legacy Fund in your will, please talk with Peter Svoboda or Becky Balestri.

We are grateful for the diligence of the Finance Team in making this Fund possible, and to the givers of this fund.
